What is a Keep Safe Place?

A **Keep Safe Place** is a temporary safe place a person can go to when they feel unsafe, vulnerable or upset. The venues are normally in a town or city centre setting, with the idea being that staff at the venue are able to:

- Offer reassurance
- Offer the person a place to calm down and feel safe
- Offer support with making a call or to make a call on their behalf, to either a relative or relevant service
- Make an emergency call on the person's behalf to the Police or for an Ambulance

There are a number of **Keep Safe Places** in Leicester that are open at different times of the day.

Eligibility criteria for a Keep Safe venue

A Keep Safe Place is a temporary 'safe place'. With this in mind it is important that the following criteria around suitability are considered:

- Centrally located (normally)
- The place is well known (perhaps to some of our most vulnerable people)
- Easily accessible
- Friendly
- Clearly marked with the Keep Safe Place door sticker
- Staff have been well informed of their role and what is required from them
- More than one staff member is present at any given time
- A space is available that is in plain sight

Customer care and best practice

Here is some guidance to follow should a person come and seek help.

- They may need a moment to calm down. Offer them a seat in a public area and perhaps a glass of water.
- If you feel there is no immediate threat to you or other members of staff, or the person, ask the person what help they require.
 - Would they like you to call the Police or somebody on their behalf (a carer or family member)?
 - Ask the person if they have a Keep Safe card, as this will provide some brief information about them.
 - They may need time to gather their thoughts and take a few minutes to calm down.
 - Ask them if they are aware of the My Choice website <u>https://mychoice.leicester.gov.uk/</u>, should they wish to access further help.
- If there is immediate risk of harm, or the person is injured, distressed or being targeted, the Police should be called on the '999' or '101' numbers, and/or Ambulance service if needed.
- If a child or young person requests assistance, always call the Police.
- If the person appears to have calmed down but is reluctant to leave, it is ok to ask them why. If they are still concerned for their safety, suggest that you contact the Police or somebody on their behalf.
