**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** Leicester City Council ("the Council") proposes to make an Order under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2), 5, and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby propose to makes the following Order: -

The effects of the proposed Order, will be to introduce additional no waiting at any time double yellow line parking restrictions on parts of the following road(s): Apollo Court, Atlas Close; Berners St; Jupiter Close; Pegasus Close; Pluto Close; Polaris Close; Taurus Close, & Vostock Close

To revoke certain existing Prohibitions and Restriction.

The proposals are intended to help with traffic flows at various locations on the St Peters Estate, in particular to prevent parking across dropped kerbs that are meant to be used for refuse collection vehicles to use to collect domestic waste bins from the estate. The formal reason for these proposals is to preserve or improve the amenity of the area through which the roads run.
