School Funding De-delegation Arrangements 2025-26 Consultation Analysis

Report of the Head of Finance, Education & Children's Service

1. Summary of the Report

- 1.1 This report analyses the responses to the consultation exercise carried out by Leicester City Council on the de-delegated aspect of School Funding Arrangements 2025/26. The consultation ran from Friday 4 October until Friday 1 November.
- 1.2 This report covers the responses of the maintained primary schools received during the consultation period. However, maintained secondary schools chose to meet separately after the consultation period with Anna White to feedback those responses separately to this report.

2.1. That Schools Forum determines the de-delegated items for 2025/26.

3. Report

Summary

- 3.1. The response rate to the consultation from maintained primary schools was 33% (14 out of 42 schools) (compared to 23% in the previous year). Maintained secondary schools have chosen to feedback responses separately to this report.
- 3.2. The results of the de-delegation consultation can be seen in the data below.

4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1. This report only covers the maintained primaries. There was a relatively low return rate to the consultation although a better return rate to the previous year.

Of the fourteen primary school responses received, the de-delegation items have either unanimous or significant majority 'yes' responses. Secondary school responses will be reported separately from meetings that superseded this consultation.

If collectively schools do not de-delegate any of these strands, individually they would need to decide on their own arrangements to cover the elements of that de-delegation strand (currently paid for by all of the schools).
